ExxonMobil is investing in midstream and energy infrastructure projects across eastern Harris County. These investments reinforce and enhance the safety and reliability of our existing pipeline operations.



Pipeline Work Highlights



Maintenance and replacement work will take place along more than 40 miles of pipelines in Baytown, Channelview, Pasadena, Houston, and throughout Harris County.



ExxonMobil Pipeline Company's investment in this pipeline maintenance and project work in East Harris County totals more than \$500 million.



Work began in the summer of 2020 and will continue into 2022 in certain locations.

Safety Is Our Top Priority

Safety is a core value at ExxonMobil Pipeline Company. We strive for flawless performance concerning the safety of our operations, employees, contractors, neighbors and the environment. Our safety, health and environmental performance goal is simply stated: "Nobody Gets Hurt. Not a Drop is Spilled."



X-ray examination of all pipeline welds during construction to verify integrity prior to placing the line into service



Installation at greater depths than required in many places to reduce the risk of third-party damage



Internal and external integrity assessments prior to and after placing the pipeline into service



A 24/7/365 monitoring and control system that uses computers, alarms and other technologies designed to remotely activate protective measures



A cathodic protection system designed to guard against corrosion and help ensure ongoing integrity



Aerial and ground-based inspectors regularly monitor the pipeline route for potential integrity issues

Texas Communities Support Energy Infrastructure

A survey of 150 residents living along or near local pipeline routes was conducted in May 2019. Based on survey results, surrounding communities support Texas's pipeline industry and agree that its continued growth is good for the state.



2 out of 3 respondents hold a favorable view of the pipeline industry (67% favorable)



Nearly 8 out of 10 agree that the growth of the pipeline industry is good for Texas (79% favorable)

Our Programs Benefiting East Harris County

ExxonMobil Pipeline Company supports initiatives that promote safety, education and environmental protection so that Harris County can continue to be a thriving part of a growing Texas. In 2020, we supported many organizations throughout East Harris County through our ongoing programs such as STEM,

Good Neighbor Grants and Texas A&M Engineering Extensions Service (TEEX). But we also adapted to a quickly-changing world. During the COVID-19 crisis, we shifted our operations to combat the spread of the virus. Approximately 160,000 gallons of medical-grade sanitizer was distributed

throughout Texas to medical providers, first responders and community organizations. Our team also partnered with local small businesses and organizations to distribute medical equipment, meals and masks, and donate approximately 30,000 gallons of fuel.

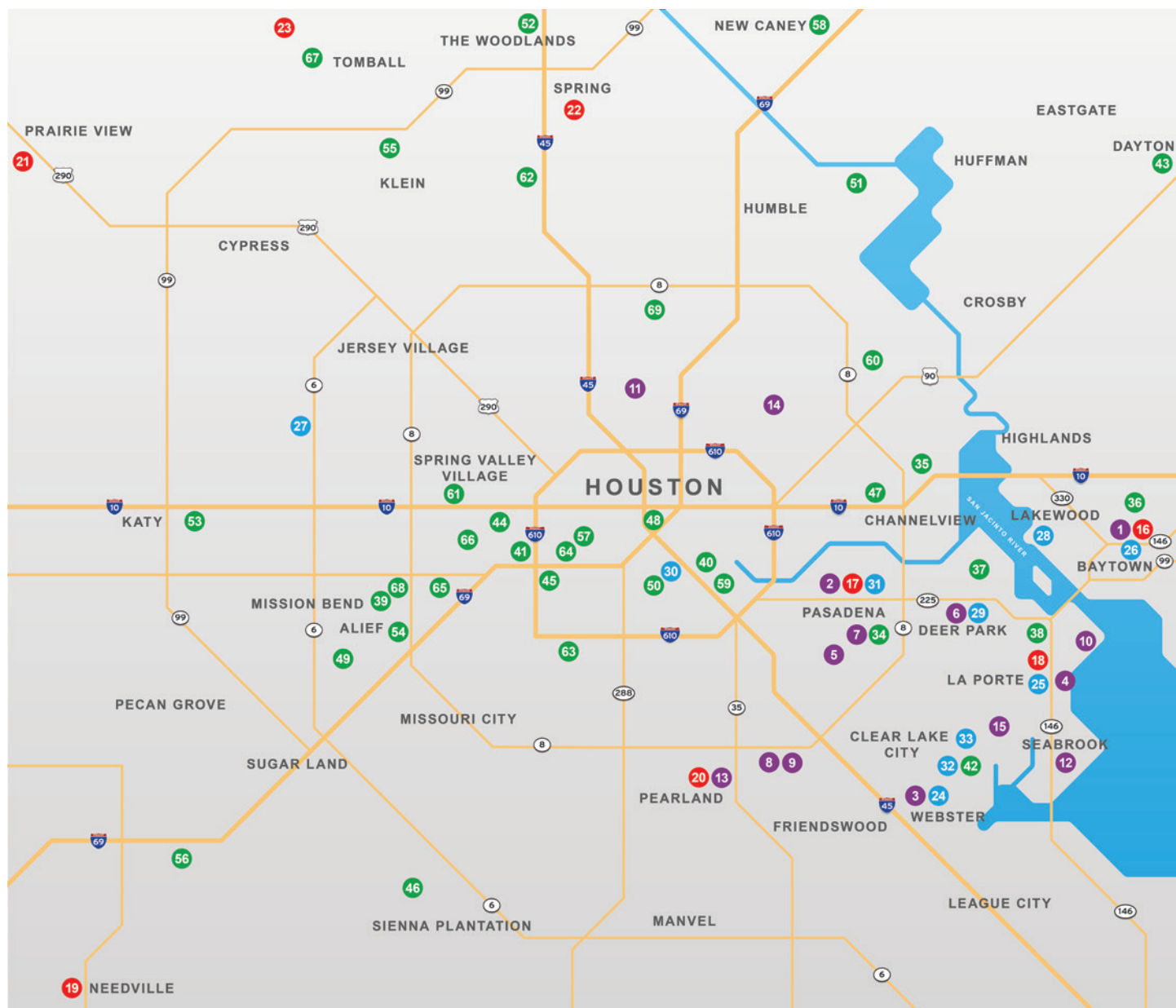
